## Camp Epachiseca "Code of Conduct" for Senior Week

We are excited for another year of Camp E and for all that God is going to do in the lives of our youth! We encourage all campers to come with excitement and an expectant faith for the Holy Spirit to move upon the hearts of our youth during camp week!

In order to ensure a healthy and positive week for all campers—and to allow space for what we as Deans believe God wants to do in the lives of the youth—the following guidelines will direct our time together:

- Disrespectful or demeaning behavior of any kind towards each other or leaders will not be tolerated. We will commit to using our words and interactions to edify and build up those around us rather than tear down and destroy. Let's choose to speak LIFE this week!
- Public displays of affection (ex. holding hands, kissing, excessive hugging, lap-sitting, etc.) will not be tolerated during our week of camp; if observed, students will be warned and asked to stop prior to more disciplinary measures being taken.
- Weather permitting, we will take a daily trip to water (Millville Pool/Lake Jean). Appropriate bathing suits are
  required to participate in these activities. For boys, swim shorts are required; for girls, one-piece swimsuits are
  required, no exceptions. Girls' swimsuits should also avoid excessively revealing cutlines including "lowcut/plunging neck lines" and "skimpy/cheeky" bottoms as well as large body "cut-outs." If any swimsuit is
  determined to be inappropriate, the student will be asked to wear a dark-colored t-shirt and dark shorts.
- Cell phones will be permitted during the week of camp; however, their use will be reserved to limited times throughout the week. Your child will be supervised by a number of capable, adult leaders during their week at camp. If there is an emergency with your child at camp, one of the Deans will contact a parent/guardian. If there is a family emergency in which a parent/guardian needs to get in touch with a camper, the Deans can be reached at the numbers provided. Our goal is to allow your child to experience a week of "unplugging" from the noise of the world and tune in to each other and the "still, small voice of the Lord."
- With the exception of "family night" on Thursday, attendance at morning and evening chapel services will be limited to Senior Week campers, Senior Week Deans, Senior Week support staff (ex. camp nurse), the Senior Week worship team, and Senior Week counselors only. Our goal is to allow campers to explore and discover a personal faith experience during camp which is free from outside influences, distractions, or pressures.
- There will be a zero-tolerance policy for illicit or illegal substances, media, materials, and paraphernalia including, but not limited to, non-prescription drugs, alcohol, chewing tobacco, cigarettes, vapes/e-cigarettes, firearms and ammunition, knives, archery equipment, or other weapons. Fishing poles, fireworks, books (except a Bible), magazines, video games, and media/mobile devices (except cell phones) are not allowed at camp. Students found in possession of any of these items will be immediately removed from camp. The only items campers are encouraged to bring are Bibles and a personal journal/notebook.

As Deans of Senior Week, we are excited to lead your child(ren) into the presence of God during their week at Camp E! While we take this Code of Conduct seriously, we do not anticipate any significant problems during our week with the youth. We passionately believe this generation of youth is the revival-generation in America! As spiritual leaders, we do not take lightly our role in their lives during this week of camp. We thank each parent/guardian in advance for your cooperation and support of this Code of Conduct, and we thank you for your willingness to entrust your most sacred possession—your child(ren)!—to us for a week of camp! May the anointing of the Holy Spirit tarry at Camp Epachiseca in July!
